Focus on Your Centers/Classroom Design

Sometimes challenging behavior has a relationship to the materials you provide in your centers and how they are structured. To find out if your classroom design/centers need tweaking, do the following:

Instructions	
Step 1	Draw your classroom
Step 2	Everyday for a week, take note of when there are challenges
Step 3	<i>Use a marker to make an X</i> where challenging behavior occurred. Try to make an X for each incident
Step 4	 See if there is a pattern (see sample). If there is, ask yourself the following questions: Are there adequate materials in this center to support the number of children who play there? Are the majority of materials in the center of high interest to the children? Are there too many children in this center? Is the center set up so that children know what to do and how to do it? Have children been introduced to the materials in the center and know the appropriate ways to interact with them? Is there one item in the center that causes arguments or challenges? Are the problems due to crowding or traffic flow? Do the activities in the center require adult supervision or guidance?
